



Anthony Professor of Art History and executive vice provost of academic affairs at the University of Rochester, will become executive vice president for academic affairs and provost of the University of Richmond, effective July 1.

Saab is an experienced administrator and distinguished art history and visual culture scholar with more than 20 years of academic and leadership appointments at Rochester, where she is also currently serving as interim dean of the faculty of Arts, Sciences, & Engineering.

"Dr. Saab's passions and expertise as a scholar and administrator align with our own institutional priorities," said University of Richmond President Kevin F. Hallock. "At her core, she believes in advancing educational opportunities for students of all backgrounds, which echoes our commitments to academic excellence, access and affordability, and belonging."

"The provost plays an essential role in ensuring continued academic excellence and innovation, and we are very pleased to welcome Dr. Saab to the University community in this role," said R. University of Richmond Student Selected to Participate in Prestigious Fulbright Summer Institute in the UK

SOPHOMORE CHLOE GOODE IS FIRST IN UR'S HISTORY TO RECEIVE AWARD

UNIVERSITY OF RICHMOND — Chloe Goode, a University of Richmond sophomore from Richmond, Virginia, has received a competitive opportunity to study at Queen's University Belfast through a Fulbright Summer Institute in the United Kingdom. Goode is one of 36 students to participate, and she is the first Richmond student to receive this award.

The program, which targets U.S. undergraduates who have little to no international travel experience and are unlikely to travel outside the U.S. without financial support, is one of the most prestigious and selective summer scholarship programs in the world. The Fulbright US-UK Summer Institutes promote leadership, learning, and empathy among nations through educational exchange.

Summer Institute participants are selected through a rigorous application and interview process that considers academic merit, leadership potential, and cultural curiosity. Many are low-income and/or first-generation college students from a diverse range of backgrounds.

"I will be the first person in my immediate family to travel to the UK, and I could not be more grateful," Goode said. "I would not have the means to travel internationally without the assistance of a program like Fulbright."

Goode will spend three weeks studying the historical, cultural, political, environmental, and socio-economic factors of Northern Ireland. Participants also engage with local communities and visit political, historical, and cultural sites.

"I will have the opportunity to work with academic experts and a bright cohort of peers from various backgrounds while embarking on once-in-a-lifetime experiential learning opportunities," Goode said. "This will be extremely enriching culturally, academically, and on a personal level. I am confident that this work will enable me to increase my global consciousness and connect with a network of dynamic individuals."
